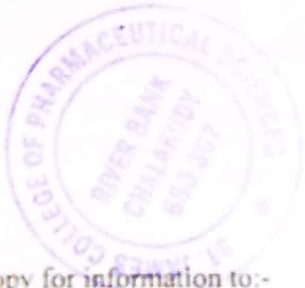

2. Accordingly, your Centre is expected to collect and collate data on adverse events associated with medical devices under MvPI immediately and report the same to NCC, from time to time


